Construction for CaroMont Regional Medical Center-Belmont Begins

On Tuesday, June 8, leaders from CaroMont Health and Belmont Abbey College celebrated the start of construction for CaroMont Regional Medical Center-Belmont and the associated medical campus. Expected to open mid-2023, the hospital will include 66-beds (54-acute care beds and 12 observation beds), 16-room emergency department, labor and delivery unit, operating rooms and surgical capabilities, and robust diagnostic testing and imaging services. Also planned is a medical office building and parking deck.

"To this day, CaroMont Regional Medical Center has over 250,000 patient encounters a year. That's 250,000 opportunities for our team of providers to change lives," said Chris Peek. "We are building more than a hospital, more than a medical campus, we are building the future. In three short years, this will be the site of so much hope and promise – where new life is welcomed, where patients heal and where the next generation of healthcare professionals find their purpose."
