About the Community Health Needs Assessment (CHNA)



- A Community Health Needs Assessment identifies key health needs and issues through systematic, comprehensive data collection and analysis. The CHNA provides healthcare entities, policy makers and community partners with comprehensive information about the community's current health status, needs and issues.
- CaroMont Health and Gaston County Public Health jointly conducted the 2024 Community Health Needs Assessment.
- This abridged report provides an overview of the health status of Gaston County residents, including information obtained through a Quality-of-Life survey with high representation from historically marginalized populations.

About the CHNA (continued)



- Gaston County Public Health (GCPH) will release additional data later in 2025 and a full report in early 2026. Together, with other healthcare and community partners, CaroMont Health will finalize the prioritization of health issues and develop a Community Health Improvement Plan (CHIP) by October 31, 2025.
- A CHIP is a longer-term, systematic effort to address population health problems based on the results of community health assessment activities and the community health improvement process.

Developing a CHNA



- Three distinct methods were used to conduct the Community Health Needs Assessment:
 - Primary Data Collection A community Quality of Life Survey was conducted at a variety of venues throughout the spring and summer of 2025. Although convenience sampling was the primary method, venues were chosen specifically to obtain reasonable representation both geographically and demographically. Over 1,000 surveys were completed during this period.
 - Focus Groups Three focus groups were conducted. One group was conducted in Spanish, one with teens, and the other group was targeted towards families with young children.
 - Secondary Data Collection Data were collected from a wide array of sources including the NC State Center for Health Statistics, the U.S. Census Bureau and other database systems.


The primary service area of CaroMont Regional Medical Center is Gaston County, North Carolina. This conclusion is based on an analysis of hospital discharges by county of origin for calendar year 2024. Approximately 79.0 percent of the hospital's discharges are derived from Gaston County, while Cleveland, Lincoln, Mecklenburg and York Counties represent 17.8 percent of discharges combined. Another 3.2 percent of the hospital's discharges come from outside the five-county region outlined in the adjacent map.



Gaston County, NC, 2019-2023








Quality of Life Survey










Chronic lower respiratory disease mortality, 2019-2023

Chronic lower respiratory disease mortality




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
Alzheimer's disease mortality, 2019-2023 Gaston County, NC and comparison

Alzheimer's disease mortality





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Infant Mortality Rates




Infant mortality rate (NC) by Race/Ethnicity, Gaston County, NC




Births with at least one maternal risk factor by Race/Ethnicity, Gaston County, NC

Very preterm births by Race/Ethnicity, Gaston County, NC



Cancer diagnosis rate by Race/Ethnicity, Gaston County, NC






Respondents satisfied with healthcare, 2025

Respondents satisfied with healthcare by Race/Ethnicity, Gaston County, NC






Respondents with a primary care provider, 2025

Respondents with a primary care provider by Race/Ethnicity, Gaston County, NC









Survey Response I have delayed healthcare due to cost




Respondents who delayed care by Race/Ethnicity, Gaston County, NC


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Uninsured Population



Uninsured residents by Race/Ethnicity, 2019-2023





High School Graduation Rates





2022-2024



- Increase access to care in the following service lines behavioral health, cardiovascular, primary care, oncology and urgent care (providers and sites)
- 2. Enhance strategies to reduce infant mortality
 - Three additional CaroMont Women's sites of care (Belmont, Lake Wylie, Lincolnton)
 - Collaborate with the Department of Health & Human Services
 - Sleep sack distribution to all families with newborns (in collaboration with Women Optimizing Wellness)
- 3. Enhance community collaboration and leadership to reduce substance abuse; other strategies include
 - Bridge therapy access expansion
 - Hire additional social workers
 - Enhance collaboration between family practice and behavioral health providers
