Employees Eligible to Make Mid-Year Health Benefit Changes

From now until Monday, August 31, employees will have the opportunity to add or drop coverage for medical, dental and vision plans without a qualifying life event, as well as make changes to contribution amounts to a medical and/or dependent care Flexible Spending Account (FSA). CaroMont is now allowed to provide you with this temporary flexibility based on recent IRS guidelines. Additionally, most over-the-counter drugs are now reimbursable with your medical FSA without a prescription required.

NOW OPEN: CaroMont Urgent Care in Belmont

On Tuesday, July 14, CaroMont Health added another location to its growing clinical network with the opening of CaroMont Urgent Care in Belmont. Located at 1223 Spruce Street, the new office will offer expert care for urgent medical issues seven days a week from 8:00 a.m. to 7:30 p.m.

"In a family-oriented community like Belmont, urgent care is important to ensure patients have access to flexible care options," said Costa Andreou, MD, Executive Vice President. "CaroMont Urgent Care is located a short distance from CaroMont Pediatric Partners, CaroMont Women's Health and South Point Family Practice, to name a few, so the location should be very convenient for both existing and new patients to CaroMont Health."

The 4,950 square-foot-facility includes onsite x-ray and laboratory testing, and healthcare providers will offer care and treatment for minor illnesses and injuries, such as colds, ear infections and sprained ankles. As in all CaroMont Health facilities, additional COVID-19 safety protocols, such as social distancing, enhanced cleaning measures and required face covers, are in place to ensure the safety and comfort of all patients.

On Tuesday, August 4, CaroMont Health will launch Voalte, a new clinical communication platform, at CaroMont Regional Medical Center. Voalte, an industry leader in healthcare communication, integrates the electronic medical record (EMR), nurse call and patient monitoring systems to provide streamlined, secure communication between caregivers both inside and outside hospital walls.

Also included in the launch is Lightning Bolt, which will integrate the on-call database and physician scheduling into Voalte, allowing physicians to access the information on desktop and mobile applications.


CaroMont Health Foundation Selects 2020 Wayne F. Shovelin Scholar
